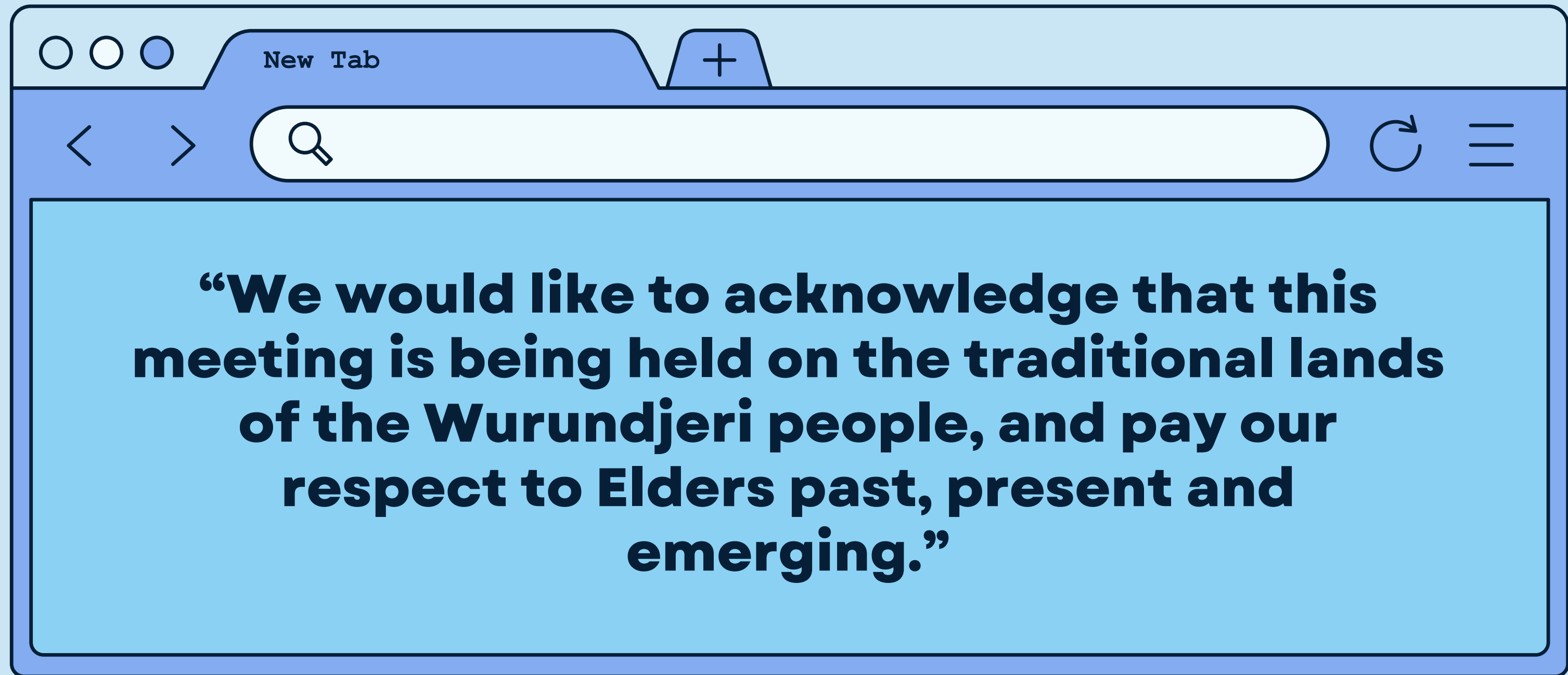

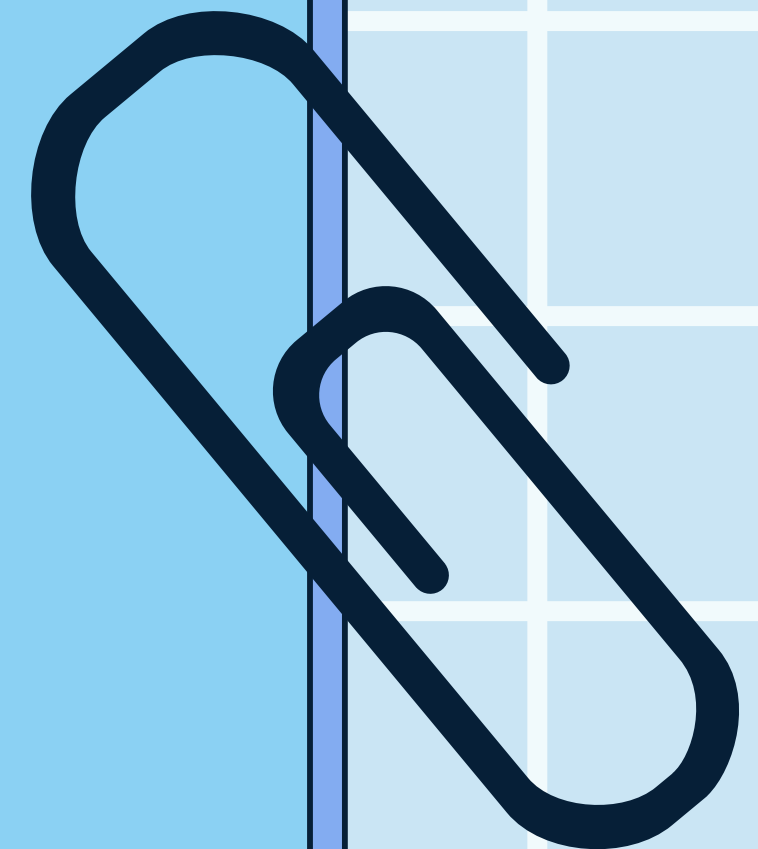

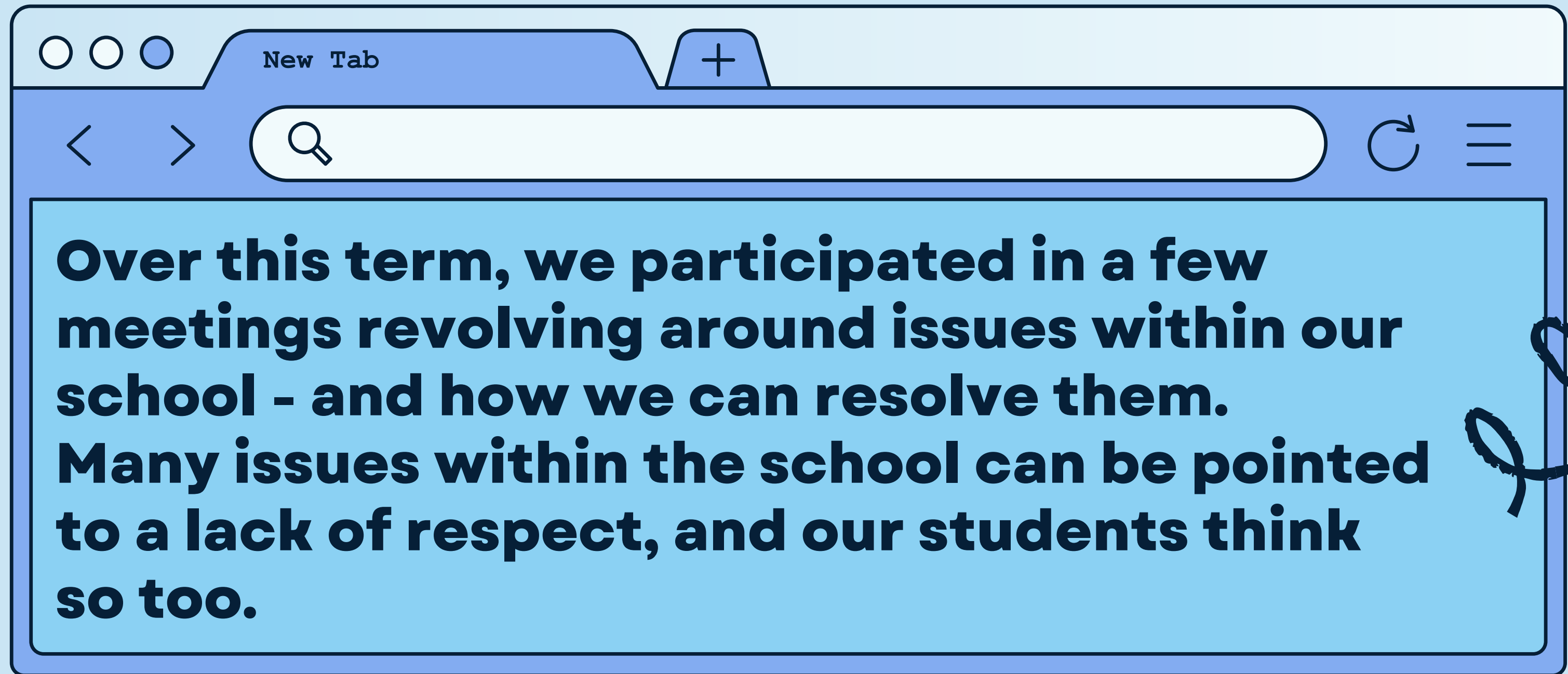
The learning intention for today is for teachers to understand the reason which students choose not to respect the school, and ways which we can create positive student-teacher relationships.

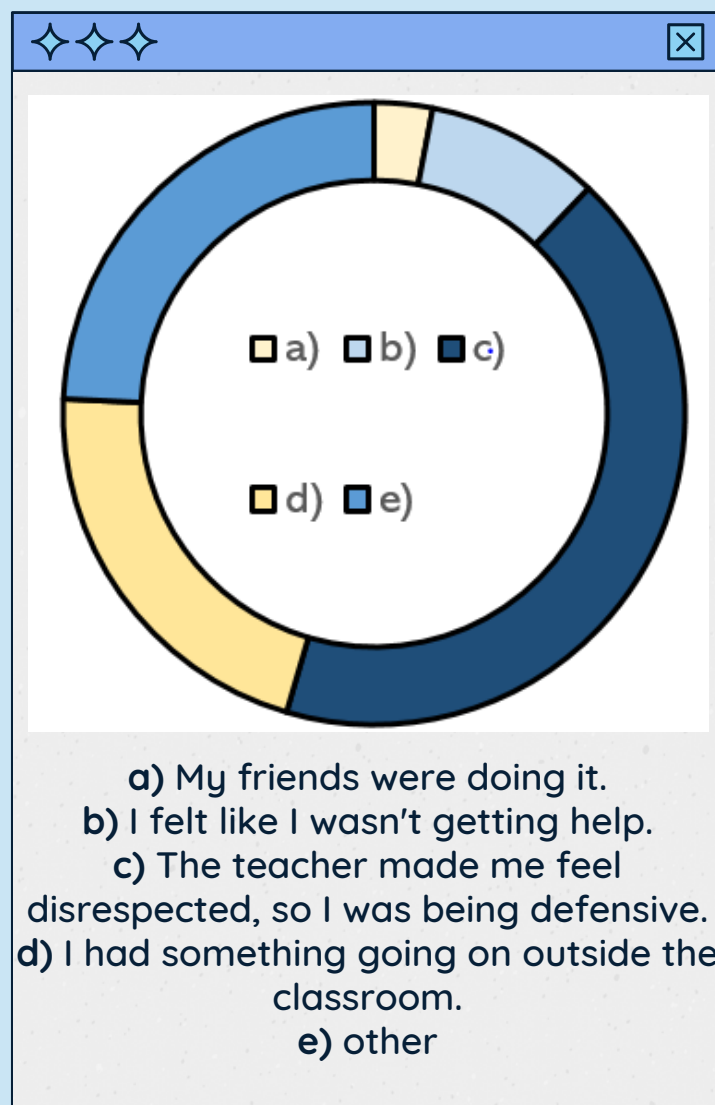
Success Criteria: At the end of today's session, teachers should be confident to increase student voice in the classroom and discourage disrespectful behaviour.

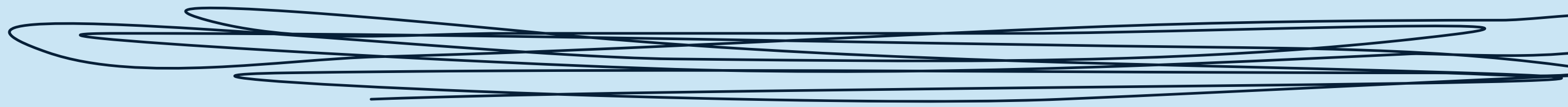
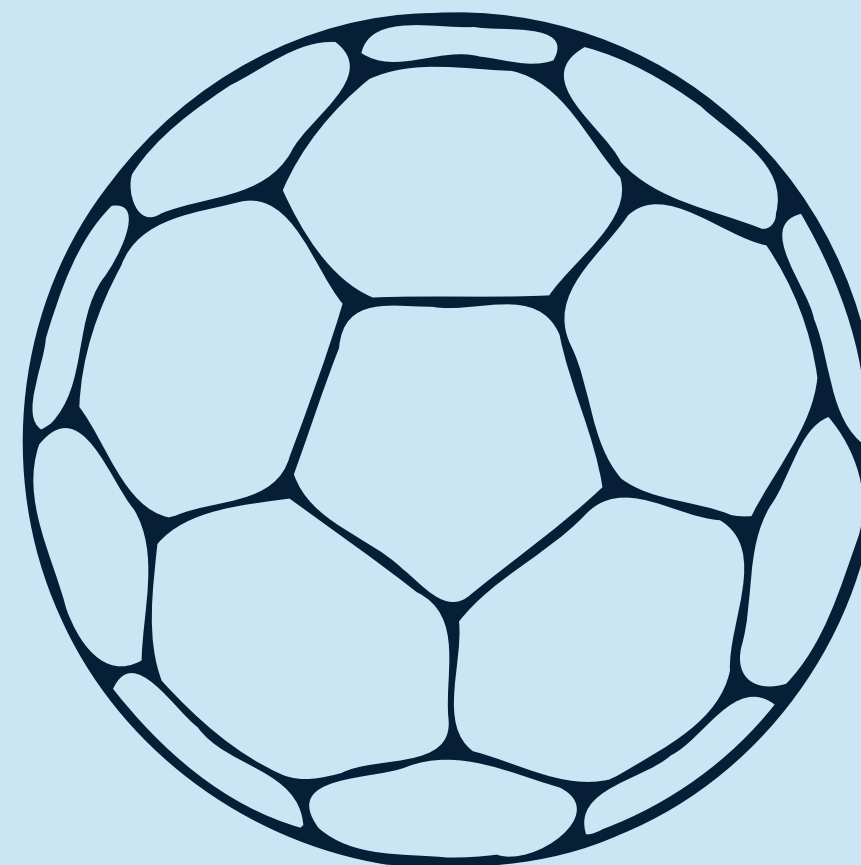
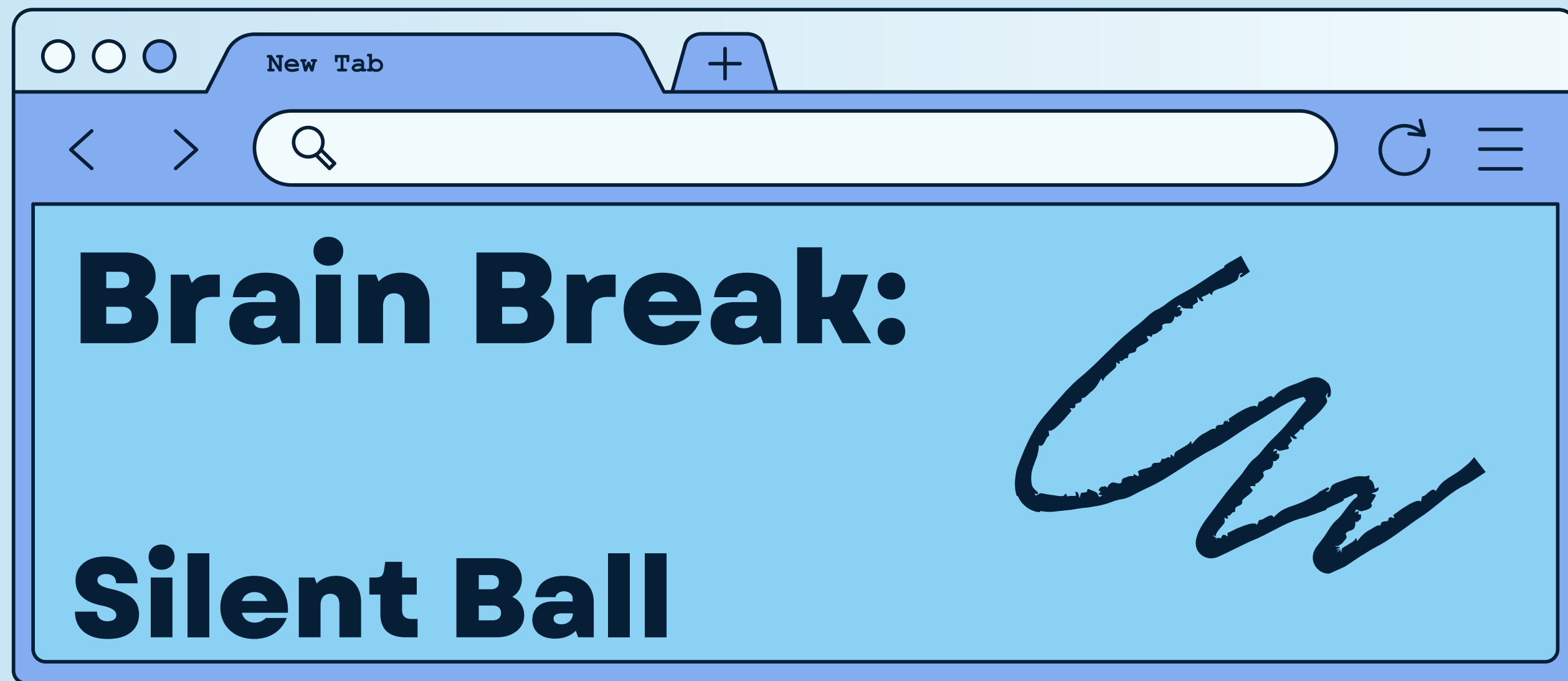


What do teachers
want from students?

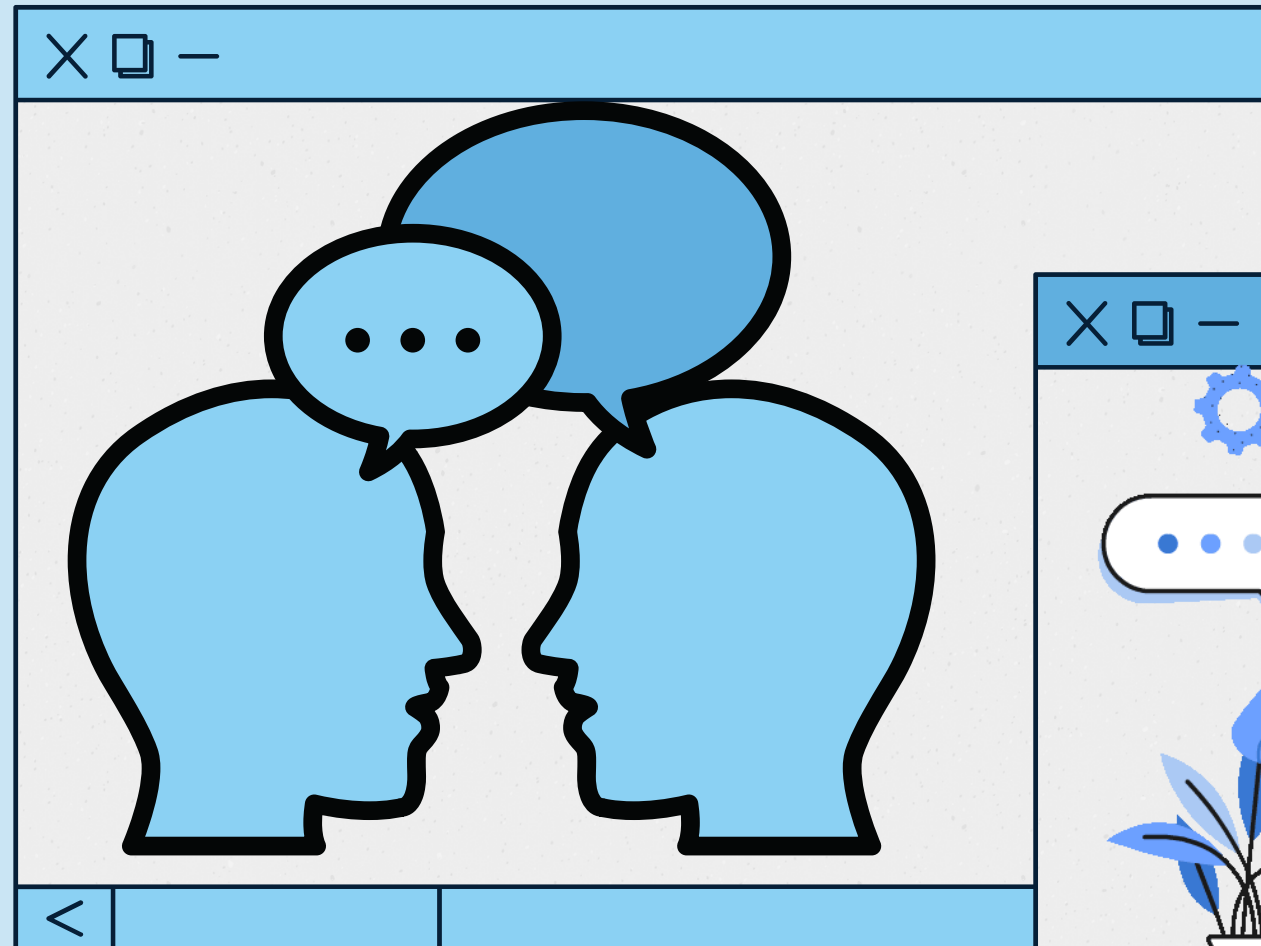
What do students
want from teachers?

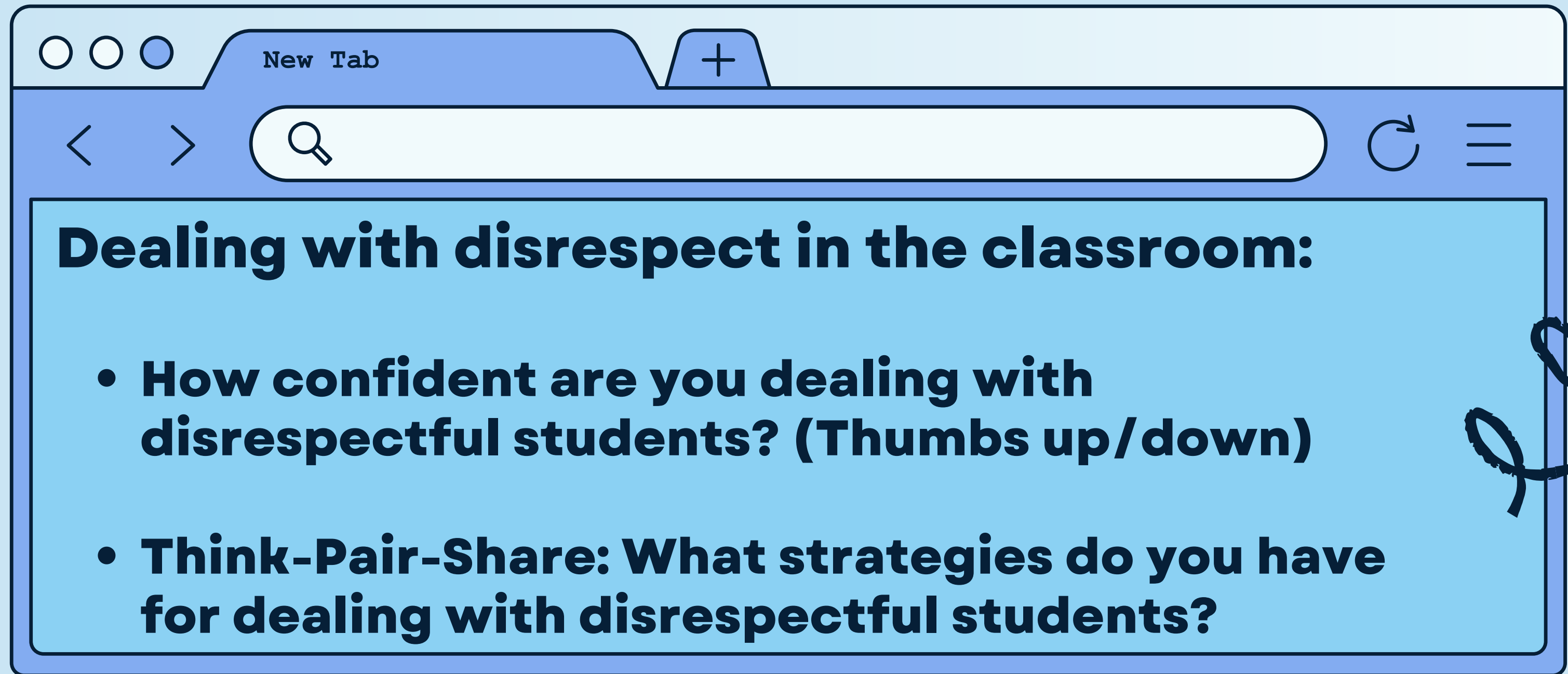
If students keep

Whole Group Discussion





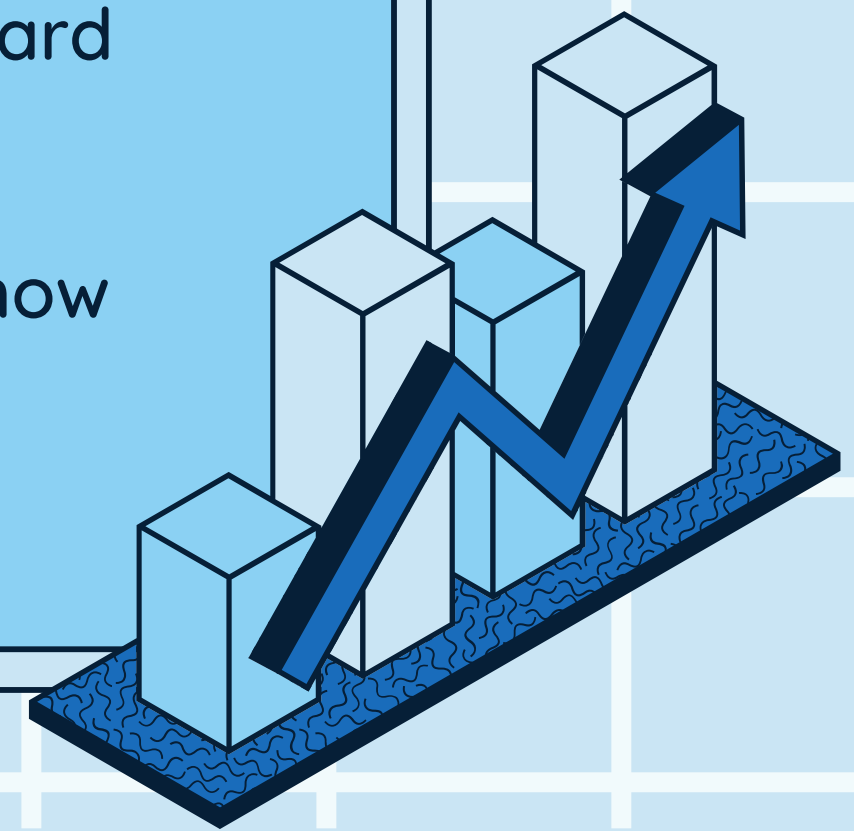


Our students want to feel supported and respected at WSC.
